1. Stone Bus Shelter- Stone & Labour were donated
2. Millennium Sculpture – Stone & Labour were donated
3. The Parish Council is the custodian trustee of the land which the Village Hall is situated and the playground land adjacent and extends a nominal value of £1. The deeds are held in the custody of the Clerk. The village Hall and garages are separately insured by the Village Hall Committee
4. North Northamptonshire Council will carry out weekly inspections of the playground which exceed the required standards, and ROSPA inspections every six months. Maintenance is carried out by North Northamptonshire Council. All necessary insurance – Public Liability, Personal Accident, Fidelity Guarantee is in place. The playground equipment is not insured, any repairs are carried out by North Northamptonshire Council and should any equipment prove to be beyond repair it will be removed and the Parish Council will decide if /when it would be replaced at the Parish Council's expense.
5. The telephone kiosk, no longer in use, was bought from BT for £1
6. The WW1 Stone War Memorial was built on land donated by Major Thurburn. No further records can be found. Kettering Borough Council confirmed it was not owned by them, therefore Great Cransley Parish Council took on the responsibility of ownership. It was refurbished in 2016 with grants from the War Memorial Trust and Kettering Borough Council
7. The defibrillator in the Telephone Kiosk is owned and insured by the Community Heartbeat Trust under the Managed Solution Agreement.
