I want to thank Chris Kelly for having a go at it, but apparently it was not breaking even.

Recently Chris organised an open evening to see if there was any way the village could get together to make a bid for the Pub and run it as a Community Pub, and although only 13 people turned up to discuss this, it was hoped that word would spread and some effort to open negotiations would ensue, however to date no approach has been made.

There is currently a window of opportunity for Communities to take advantage of Government Grants that will match half the purchase price and I would have thought this would have been a massive incentive for you to own your own Pub, but I do appreciate the population of Cransley has to be a limiting factor in raising half the purchase price.

If there are any parties who wish to approach me to try to find a way to Purchase the Pub, I am available to listen and help in any way I can, but if not I intend to put the property on the open market.
