GREAT CRANSLEY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Dear Villager

In the near future we will be circulating a Great Cransley Neighbourhood Plan (NP) Questionnaire to every household in the Parish. Please do take time to read it and respond to it, as it will make an important contribution to the future of your Parish.

Local Planning is dealt with by Kettering Borough Council (KBC). Therefore, KBC is given a target by central government for the number of new homes for which it must allocate development land across its towns and villages. In turn, KBC inform us (your Parish Council) that each Parish in the Borough would have to provide land for development and that we could no longer just say “no” to any future development.

The NP gives an opportunity for each Parish to have some input into the location of any future expansion in their own community, and also identify what future improvements residents would like to see. In return for villagers being thoughtful about where development is best suited and what facilities are desired, there can be amounts of money allocated, not just for schooling, health and policing. This happens through a scheme called Section 106 (S106) and can bring financial resources for things like traffic calming to the village. There is also a scheme called CIL which isn't used by KBC now, but may do similar things to S106 in the future.

We have yet to be informed by KBC planning department officers exactly how many houses Great Cransley may be asked to provide. If we (The Parish Council) are able to take the process all the way to its conclusion with your support, then we will have our own plan that KBC will have to take notice of in the light of any planning applications in the future. If we do not, then we as a Parish will have little say on what is allocated or where, as it will all be done by KBC under their own “all encompassing” Local Plan.

Please do talk about the questionnaire with friends and family, complete it and return it. We will collate the findings and then create a plan and ask for your feedback, prior to going for an external examination to make sure it fits in with the wider planning and development picture, with neighbouring towns and villages.

It's the best way to try to influence the future for ourselves and future generations.
