SIR CLIVE ROSE G.C.M.G.

It is with great sadness that I have to report the passing of Sir Clive Rose, on Wednesday, the 17th April, at the age of 97 years.

Sir Clive was President of the Cransley Bell Fund Trust, and a devoted supporter of the Committee that, under his guidance, managed to achieve so much in such a short space of time.

Sir Clive was a direct descendant of the Robinson family, who resided at the Hall in the XVI century and were responsible for the peal of bells that we enjoy today. The name became Rose though the Female line, and there are many memorials in the Church today both to the Robinsons and the Rose family. Indeed his own name is also recorded there, recognising his valuable contribution to the cause of restoring the bells in the late eighties/early nineties.
