DOG FOULING ON ROADS AND FOOTPATHS IN THE PARISH

Unfortunately the incidence of Dog Fouling is on the increase again. All Dog Owners will be aware of the legal requirement to clean up their Dogs' mess while walking on our roadways and footpaths, and will also be aware of the location of the village bins.

The fine for not clearing your Dogs' mess, if caught by an authorised Officer, is £100 and the Parish Council has asked the Unitary Authority to get their officers to monitor our Village.

Some Dog Owners seem to pick up their Dogs' mess then leave the bags on the side of the road for others to clear up ... this is not acceptable, and we appeal to all residents to help us combat this antisocial and selfish action.

There are 2 residents, that we are aware of, who kindly pick up litter and Dog mess to try to keep our Village tidy, and we are very grateful for this.

The reason for the anxiety concerning Dog fouling is not just the sight and smell of Dog Poo, but the potentially very serious illness of Toxocara which can be caught from the parasitic roundworms that can live in Dogs' intestines, and which can be transmitted to Humans and ultimately cause blindness....Children are particularly at risk.

SO ALL DOG OWNERS please ACT RESPONSIBLY
