INFORMATION FROM KETTERING BOROUGH COUNCIL

Kettering Borough Council confirms that it was made aware of earthworks being undertaken at land to the north east side of Cransley Road, Loddington, on Friday 11th October and the Council immediately drafted a temporary stop notice which was served at the weekend.

Kettering Borough Council, on 15th October 2019, served an enforcement and permanent stop notice at the site.

This is part of planning enforcement powers that require the site owner, and any other interested parties, to cease the unauthorised use of the land and to return it to its previous state.

The stop notice takes effect on 19th October 2019 when all the activities specified upon the notice shall cease. The enforcement notice allows a 28 day effective period where the landowner has legal rights to submit an appeal to the Planning Inspector.

KBC is aware of the state of the roads in the area, and we have contacted NCC as the local Highways agencies regarding the safety and cleanliness of the road.

The Council has no powers to prevent or stop the delivery of goods to the site. However, where we have been informed of the companies that have delivered to the site, through photographic evidence, we have written to them to ensure that they are aware that they are delivering to an unauthorised development.

Kettering Borough Council is doing everything it can within its powers to address this situation.

ARE YOU THINKING ABOUT QUITTING SMOKING?

- There are 87,438 smokers in Northamptonshire
- Between January and August 2019, 1,978 smokers have set a quit date with a Northamptonshire stop smoking provider
- Of those 1,978 people, 771 have successfully quit
- 15.1% of the Northamptonshire population smoke (similar to the national average – 14.4%)
- The area with the most smokers is Wellingborough – 19.9%
- The area with the least smokers is South Northamptonshire – 7.2%
- Our smoking during pregnancy numbers are significantly worse than the national average (10.8% England vs 13.1% Northants)
- Our rates of smoking attributable hospital admissions & mortality is also significantly worse than the national average

IT'S TIME TO BOOK IN YOUR FLU JAB

Northamptonshire County Council and the Northamptonshire's Clinical Commissioning Groups are once again urging people to get their flu vaccines booked in as winter approaches.

Flu is a highly infectious viral illness which can lead to complications, hospital admissions and even death. Symptoms of flu include fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, headaches, body aches and tiredness. Those people in 'at risk' groups are also susceptible to further complications.

This winter, the vaccine is free of charge for the following people:

- All children aged between two and ten on or before 31 August 2019
- Those aged between six months and 64 years in clinical risk groups*
- Pregnant women – women in any trimester of pregnancy
- Those aged 65 years and over
- Those in long-stay residential care homes
- Carers (informal carers who are in receipt of a carer allowance or a main carer of a vulnerable person)
- Frontline staff in direct patient contact working for primary care, community and acute NHS trusts or social care staff employed by a registered residential care/nursing home/domiciliary care provider or voluntary managed hospice provider who are directly involved in the care of vulnerable people are also eligible for free flu vaccinations

People belonging to any of these groups should speak to their GP to book a vaccination, or visit a local pharmacy as they may also provide free flu vaccinations.

Anyone in doubt about whether they qualify for a free vaccination should contact their GP.
