## WAR MEMORIAL RESTORATION

As you've been making your way in and out of the village in the last couple of weeks hopefully you will have been distracted (although not so much as to end up on one of our bell bollards!) by our recently cleaned and restored War Memorial.

Stones which had cracked and sunk around the front of the memorial have been replaced and the whole memorial has been carefully cleaned and re-pointed.

The work was completed by Darren Tebbutt, Stonemason and was kindly funded by a grant from the War Memorials Trust, topped up by a grant from Kettering Borough Council. We hope you'll agree that it has substantially improved the look of the memorial, making it a more fitting tribute to those from the village who lost their lives in both wars.

Richard Barnwell has spent many hours researching all of the names on the memorial and we hope to have the fruits of his labours up on the Parish website in the next few months, so that it's possible for us to gain an insight into the lives and families of those remembered.
