## **2023 CORONATION OF KINGS CHARLES THE THIRD**

6<sup>th</sup> of May will be an important milestone in the life of our country and of course, our village, being the first Coronation of the 21<sup>st</sup> century and the 40<sup>th</sup> since 1066. For many of us the death of our late Queen last September was a great shock and her incredible example to us all will be hard to follow; but we know that our new monarch has great empathy for the United Kingdom, its peoples and traditions and we all wish him well.

In Great Cransley there appeared to be no desire to have any special event for the occasion, but we are delighted that John and Lisa, the new owners of the Three Cranes Inn have kindly offered to open the pub to give residents, family and friends the opportunity to come together to enjoy the spectacle, with refreshments available on the usual terms.

On Saturday there will be TV coverage of the ceremony from 11am, with crown making for children during the day then music from 4pm. On Sunday the pub will be open with a Royal Quiz starting at 3pm with prizes; face painting for children and coverage of the evening Coronation Concert. On bank holiday Monday the pub will be open with the draw for a special raffle at 2pm (tickets available over the weekend) with prizes including butcher vouchers etc.

All funds raised will go towards providing an Emergency Bleed Kit which will be sited with the defibrillator in Bridle Way and available to residents in case of emergency.

We are grateful to John and Lisa for all their efforts and wish them well in their new venture which we know will be supported by village residents and visitors alike.

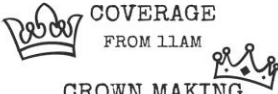

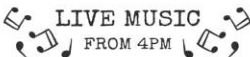

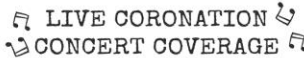
